CLASSIC CUP SOFTBALL TOURNAMENT RULES

- 1. Pitching nets must be used in parks equipped with them (SAFETY FIRST). If a batted ball hits net, it is a dead ball and not counted as a strike. If a thrown ball hits the net, ball is in play.
- 2. No steel cleats, no bunting, no stealing and no leading. Sliding is allowed at any base other than home.
- 3. Infield fly rule is in effect.
- 4. Safety lane is in effect, as well as commitment line between 3rd base and home plate.
- 5. Tagging-up is allowed at all bases.
- 6. Three (3) pitches to men and women. If pitcher is hit by a batted ball on the 1st or 2nd pitch, the play is dead and counts as a strike; if the pitcher is hit by a batted ball on the 3rd pitch, the batter is out, and base runners do not advance. If a pitching net is used, a batted ball hitting the net is a dead ball, not a strike.
- 7. Batting order is alternating men and women. If there are an uneven number of either men or women, two lists must be maintained to ensure it alternates.
- 8. Defensive alignment is 10 players of which no more than six (6) can be men.
- 9. Defensive players may stand anywhere on the field in fair territory. There must be a catcher behind the plate.
- 10. Balls thrown in from rovers or outfielders must first be thrown to an infielder before being thrown to opposing pitcher, or any base runner may try to advance at his/her own risk.
- 11. Maximum five (5) runs per inning. Last inning open in all round-robin and playoff games. Round-robin and playoff games are five (5) innings. Finals are seven (7) innings. Play out all round-robin games; run difference will break ties. Playoffs do not need to be played out.
- 12. Home team decided by coin toss for round-robin games. In playoff games, team finishing higher in standings will be home team. If tied, higher run difference will decide.
- 13. If a team has only two or three (2 or 3) women, the third and/or fourth woman in batting spot is an automatic out.
- 14. For a player to be eligible for playoff games, he/she must be on the team roster and have played in at least one round-robin game.
- 15. To be out at home, a defensive player must be on home plate. Base runner cannot be tagged between commitment line and home plate.

- 16. Ties are allowed in round-robin games. Each team gets 50 points plus their score. There are no ties in the playoffs. If a game is tied (playoffs), last batter goes to 2nd base with 1 out to start the inning. Play continues this way until 1 team is up after the complete inning.
- 17. A pinch runner is allowed from home plate. If you use a pinch runner in a game (last person out of the same gender), you must use a pinch runner for the rest of the game. Pinch runner does not need to stop at first.
- 18. Once the ball goes back to the pitcher, no appeal of a play may be made.
- 19. Winning teams receive 100 points plus their score. Losing teams only count their score.
- 20. For a base runner to be safe at home plate, any part of his/her body over theline ahead of the throw is OK. Base runner does not have to be completely over the line.
- 21. Only coaches talk to umpires. Players arguing or fighting risk being thrown out. Any player continually arguing, or fighting will be thrown out of the game.
- 22. A player, if he/she wishes, can pitch only. However, he/she must be on the team roster. If a player hits, he/she must play one defensive inning. If a player decides to pitch only, it must be made clear at the beginning of the game.
- 23. Please note that only ASA or USSSA approved bats will be allowed in the tournament. There is a list available on the website of ASA stamped bats which are, in fact, illegal. Bats need to be challenged during the game, not after the game is finished.
- 24. All teams must sign a waiver and hand them in with the roster sheet before the start of the tournament.
- 25. If a base runner is hit by a batted ball anywhere on the field (including while standing on a base) he is automatically out. If the runner is on 1st or 3rd base and is hit by a batted ball in foul territory, the runner is safe, and it is a foul ball.
- 26. If a batter is taking a pinch runner from home plate and the batter swings and misses, the pinch runner is not out if they begin to run. It counts as strike not an out.
